

Bratislava Chess camp with tournaments

Trainer and organizer: Martin Hunčár huncar.martin@gmail.com +421903440480 and many others. **Martin Huncar** is coach of chess talents in Slovakia – he led Tomas Andre and is still coaching Martin Srnak, Bianka Macakova and many others.

Tournament „A“ Standard FIDE 15.7.-19.7. 2024 is open for all age categories, is FIDE rated, for chess players with rating 1500 – 1799. 9 rounds, 30 minutes/game + 30 minutes /move. Every day are two rounds 9:00 and 10:30, Friday only 1 round. It is for maximum 16 players.

Tournament „B“ rapid 15.7.-19.7. 2024 is only for players who are not registered in chess clubs or for those who do not play A tournament. It will be rapid not FIDE rated. Every day we play in the morning 4 games (from 9:00 to 12:00), Friday only 2 games. Together it is 18 rounds (against 9 players twice). 25 min/game for each player.

Tournament „C“ blitz FIDE 19.7. 2024. Friday afternoon 1 pm - blitz tournament – 9 rounds, 4 minutes/game + 2 sec/move.

Program: You can choose to be part of afternoon activities – camp – we will play in forest, Archery will be main part as well. Around 15:15 we return to Nemecky kulturny dom for chess training and then we play some games until parents will pick up children (16:15-16:45).

Starting fee: 160€ (includes lunches, refreshments, rewards, training). Players of „A“ or „B“ tournament which do not participate in afternoon program **pay only 50 Eur** (includes small refreshment without lunch)

If you need accommodation, we recommend hotel Bivio, which is 7 minutes by walk from playing hall and we will go there for lunches <https://bivio.sk/en/>
