Scope of the report

This report represents a detailed presentation of the activity of the FIDE Commission for Women's Chess [WOM] in Q1 2023.

1.1. Introduction

FIDE Commission for Women's Chess (WOM) mission is making chess beloved and available for girls and ladies around the world. We devote 2023 to specifying the ways of involving more girls in chess, keeping professional players in sport and decreasing early career ending among female chess players.

Professional chess tournaments offer an excellent framework to study the existence of gender interaction but chess is a male-dominated game till now. There is a persistent and non-negligible performance gap between men and women. Women make up only 16% of FIDE master list, 11 % of FIDE classical rated players, only 2% of women are GMs. Performance gap is also impressive because out of 100 adults playing chess only 1 is female, out of 100 Juniors only 3 are the girls.

Although the situation is improving with time, but still very slowly. FIDE Commission for Women's Chess is aimed at shifting the focus to a clear goal of boosting female participation and reducing drop-out. We orientate on general promotion of chess for everybody instead of focusing on narrow field of professional chess.

1.2. Work principles

In order to be efficient and performant, a set of internal procedures and principles were settled.

1.2.1. Internal Procedures

General

- Meritocracy and democracy are fundamental principles of WOM commission.
 - $\circ~$ Meritocracy each person's efforts will be presented and promoted through FIDE
 - $\circ~$ Democracy all important decisions will be decided by the majority of WOM commission.
- Active persons will have priority in choosing projects.





1.3. Organization

Organization

- WOM commission is organized in workgroups. Six workgroups are defined inside the commission, which will be described in the 1.3. Section.
- There are 6 workgroups:
 - o Chess4all & All4Chess
 - Global survey + women in chess index
 - ChessMom
 - Creating female national teams
 - Updating rules of Queens' Festival 2023
 - \circ Chess seminars for women and online/hybrid seminars for professionals
- Each workgroup has a responsible, called head of workgroup.
- Every workgroup has objectives, projects, procedures.
- The head of workgroup will have the following responsibilities:
 - Organizing and calling the meetings
 - Being in charge with delegation inside the workgroup

 $\circ~$ If a head of workgroup is not available, then he will assign the responsibility to another person.

1.5. Core projects 2023

It is very important to mention that WOM core projects are based on the impressive and working experience of 2022 YOWIC, which we are honored to update and increase where it is necessary. In early 2023 WOM also launched partnership with ECU Commission for Women's Chess and planning prosperous further cooperation.

Main practical instrument of WOM to achieve the abovementioned goals is implemented and planned projects, organized in cooperation with national chess federations and FIDE Commissions.

Before preparing this report WOM has been actively engaged on the following projects:

• **Chess4all & All4Chess.** The idea of this project is to involve as much girls and ladies as possible around the world to be interested in chess, to play chess, to get new profession via chess. Project consists of 2 stages:

Chess4all - series of the monthly workshops and chess activities in different continents, countries with famous chess players and female chess role models to explain that chess is not only professional sport, but adventure, hobby or even potential profession (chess instructor in school, chess arbiter, chess organizer, chess journalist, streamer, painter, politician etc.) Chess has no limits, chess is equal, chess is safe and tolerant. Chess can open a lot of possibilities in life, in profession, in business (chess school, chess magazine, chess shop etc.).

All4Chess – chess events with famous non-chess people, who like chess: chess fans vs professional female chess players – planning for 2024.

Examples of successfully held Chess4all project:

1) 17 December 2022 Katowice, Poland - "Gwiazdka szachowa" - the 1st Chess4all & All4Chess event in cooperation with European Chess Union Commission for Women's Chess & Organizing Committee of the European Rapid and Blitz Chess Championship 2022.

It is worthy of note that all Chess4all & All4Chess events are only co-financed by FIDE, the major part of the budget is covered by local organizers/partners.

• **Chess seminars for ladies** - educational event organized similar as arbiters' seminar, organizers' seminar, chess trainers'/instructors' seminar. Free for the participants. Examples of successfully held chess seminars:

1) 10-12 March 2023 Tirana, Albania (hybrid format). The ladies-only arbiters' seminar held by IA Panagiotis Nikolopoulos, IA Mihail Prevenios, and IA Tshepiso Lopang. The Seminar gave norms and titles of FIDE Arbiter to the national arbiters nominated by their federations.

2) 17-19 March 2023 Tirana, Albania (online). The Online FIDE Trainers' Seminar for female trainers organized by the FIDE TRG Commission in cooperation with WOM. 20 women nominated by WOM participated in the ladies' seminar.

• **Queen's Gambit Challenge.** A chess crash course for females interested in learning how to play chess started on 8 March 2023. It is aimed at equipping participants with foundational knowledge on how to play the game and how to participate in a chess tournament. Which in turn will help to increase the number of female chess players throughout the Caribbean with an expected participation of over 500 females from 15 different countries. Project manager – TrisAnn Richards (Saint Lucia).

• **Global survey and women in chess index.** Project launched by GM, PhD in economics, member of FIDE Commission for Women's Chess David Smerdon.



• During FIDE Council the FIDE Commission for Women's Chess in cooperation with the Mexican Chess Federation will organize series of side events:

- Master classes with female role models: FIDE Deputy Chair of Management Board Dana Reizniece-Ozola, Director of ChessKid Español, FIDE WIM, chess commentator and streamer Ivette Garcia, more speakers will be added.
- 2) FIDE Mexican Girls&Families tournament on 6 April, 2023 in Mexico City, Mexico





In our work we also pay a lot of attention to FIDE WOM popularization via social media. Now FIDE WOM has 4 key tools for media development:

The first result of active work is impressive audience gain since January 2023: Twitter **+15%**, Facebook **+20%**, Instagram **+30%**

1.5.1. Follow-up activity

The WOM plans to continue active work on the developing of the following projects:

Chess4all & All4Chess. The upcoming Chess4all event is planned on 22 – 28 March 2023 Singapore, New Zealand, Australia in cooperation with Singapore, Australian and New Zealand Chess Federations.

Queen's Gambit Challenge. A chess crash course for females interested in learning how to play chess. It is aimed at equipping participants with foundational knowledge on how to play the game and how to participate in a chess tournament. Which in turn will help to increase the number of female chess players throughout the Caribbean with an expected participation of over 500 females from 15 different countries. Project manager – TrisAnn Richards (Saint Lucia).

Chess seminars for ladies - educational event organized similar as arbiters' seminar, organizers' seminar, chess trainers'/instructors' seminar. Free for the participants.

Global survey and women in chess index. Project managed by GM, PhD in economics, member of FIDE Commission for Women's Chess David Smerdon (Australia).

Online/hybrid seminar and workshops for professional chess players. Experience exchange event with main goal to share ideas, wishes and concerns of professionals, listen to their advice about what should be improved in women chess.

ChessMom (Pilot project for Chess Olympiad 2024). Task for 2023 is to start the preparation activities. The idea of the project is to keep professional chess players in the chess life after baby is born. Many chess players can't come to the Olympiad and other chess events because there is no possibility for them to take care about baby.





WOM proposes to FIDE to cover an extra place in the hotel if a lady brings member of the family or a babysitter to look after the baby during the Olympiad. It will be not a huge expense but can become a great social initiative. Project manager – Francisco J. Cruz Arce (Puerto Rico)

Queens' Festival 2023. Continuing (and making a tradition) a series of continental and global women's online chess tournaments and educative side events including ChessKid and FIDE only girls' unrated event. This year it will be Spanish speaking countries edition. Project manager - Ulkar Umudova (Azerbaijan).

Creating female national teams in federations without ones. Project manager -
