I.1 New Regulations - Title Regulations

The first few months of the year have been devoted to developing the Title regulations, which is the first step to building a Fair Play workforce. The drafts have been discussed with FIDE legal consultant Alex Martynov.

Also, a first list of title holders and norm holders has been produced. This is to be integrated by new nominations on or before 30.6.2023, when the only way to achieve a title or a norm will be through the then-in-force procedure.

With these new regulations, FPL creates a new qualification system and a structured way of appointments of FPOs/FPEs at events.

The first <u>Fair Play Seminar was held in Stockholm</u> on the 6th of January, 2023. While the occasion arose at almost no notice, the event's outcome was very successful. II. Fair Play Commission on the Carlsen/Niemann Report

On February 20, the 30-page report was forwarded to the Ethics and Disciplinary Commission (EDC) for further consideration.

Pursuant to Art. 5 of the EDC Procedural Rules, until a decision is made, the contents of the Report shall be kept confidential to protect the procedure itself and all interested parties.

III.FIDE Events Regulations

In the established practice, the FPO position has been bundled with the DCA position on the FIDE events.

This practice has been contradicting the FPL Rules. The reasons why these two positions (FPO and DCA) are separate are the following:

- 1. FPO doesn't need to be an arbiter, as the requirements for the tasks and skills are different
- 2. FPO's tasks are wide-ranging and sensitive; they require full attention at any given time
- 3. FPO covers the full tournament hall (playing area, spectators area, refreshment area, smoking area), including the potential outdoor activities (players' behaviors, spectators' behaviors, third party behaviors, and their activities) it secures the full scope of the event.
- 4. DCA's duties differ from the ones on the FPO (defined as in the Arbiters Manual)
- 5. FPO skills need to be developed and trained only skilled Fair Play specialists can deal with the very sensitive issues that may arise when there is a suspicion that Fair Play rules are violated improper action by the FPO can spoil the tournament, the reputation of a player, or the reputation of FIDE.

Fair Play is a combination of technical, operational & legal skills that an FPO needs to possess.

FPL wishes to bring the Council's attention to this malpractice and asks that it be halted immediately.





IV. Conclusion

The Commission is working on further improvements to its work and regulations. The main tasks for the year are associated with publishing the first list of FPO/FPEs and holding seminars to allow new forces to join the ranks.

The new regulations of titles/norms are developed to ensure a systematic approach to appointments and guarantee a professional service of the top-tier tournaments.

A Roadmap has been created for further Commission's activities.

At least one more Commission meeting in person (with a duration of at least three (3) days) is needed during the year.
