D. Regulations for Specific Competitions / 04. Other FIDE Competitions **16. FIDE World Cup U8, U10 & U12** 

#### **GENERAL REGULATIONS & RULES**

- 1. The World Cup for under 8, under 10, under 12 (hereinafter referred to as "W-Cup") shall be governed by the General Regulations for FIDE Competitions.
- 2. W-Cup is organized under the aegis of the Events Commission (hereinafter referred to as "EVE".
- 3. The competition should be held every year between 15 of June and 1 of August.
- 4. The Organizer of the World Cup has to organize the World Championship of the same year (the same age categories) if not decided otherwise by the FIDE Council.
- 5. Priority table for the event:

Year	Continent

2026	Europe
2027	Europe
2028	Asia, Africa, America

- 6. If the 2026 or 2027 bids from European federations are not considered acceptable according to FIDE EVE standards, the competitions can be organized in Asian, African or American continents instead.
- 7. If the 2028 bids from Asian, African or American federations are not considered acceptable according to FIDE EVE standards, the competition can be organized in European federations instead.
- 8. FIDE EVE is entitled to change continental priority principle.

#### **PARTICIPATION**

- 9. There shall be 3 categories; namely Under-8, Under-10 & Under-12 with separate events for Open and Girls.
- 10. All chess players who shall not reached the age of 8, 10 or 12 before January 1<sup>st</sup> of the year in which the World Cup are held are eligible to participate.
- 11. The following have a personal right and are entitled to participate provided they fulfil the condition of Rule 6 above:

- a. The three winners of the previous edition of the World Cup and the winner of the World Championship.
  - The above mentioned winners may select to play in the same age-category or a higher age-category. For example, the U10 winner may play in the U10 World Cup if he is still eligible by age or to play in U12 World Cup or U14 World Championship.
- b. The Continental Cadets Champions of the year preceding this edition.
- 12. In addition to the players mentioned in Rule 7 above, each FIDE member federation shall have the right to send one participant per category.
- 13. FIDE member federations shall have the right to send as many players as they wish.

# **SCHEDULE AND SYSTEM**

- 14. WC will be a 11-round Swiss system tournament.
- 15. The time control is 90 minutes for each player plus 30 seconds per move starting from move one. The default time is 30 minutes.
- 16. The ranking is determined by the number of points. The tie-breaks are:
  - Direct Encounter (only if all tied have played each other)
  - Buchholz Cut 1
  - Buchholz
  - The greater number of games played by black
  - The greater number of wins
  - Drawing of lots

### **FINANCIAL REGULATIONS**

17. The Organizing Committee shall provide free board and lodging (in twin share rooms) for players mentioned in Rules 7 & 8 above as well as for one accompanying person per federation provided he holds a FIDE ID.
